

Educational Intimacy is the kind of inclusive intimacy that develops among people as they support each other in working towards a shared vision.



Chroma is a youth-led organization in the Midwest U.S. for LGBTQ+ and allied youth **



**LGBTQ+ youth" here means "leabian, gay, bisexual, trans, queer, intersex, asexual, and other sexual and gender minority people between 12 and 20 years old."

We have lots of discussions about what it means to be "youth-led" and that looks different at different times.

For us, it means that in decisionmaking about Chroma activities, we prioritize the perspectives of the youth President, Vice-President, and leadership team.






Chroma meets weekly to do various activities, from playing games together to discussions about LGBTQ+ social issues.



Chroma also has a Teaching Committee, a group of youth who teach teachers and other community members about how to best support LGBTQ+ youth.




For example, Chroma youth gave professional development presentations to every teacher in their school district.

... little moments of self-deprecation, teasing, and exaggeration...




... gentle helping behaviors...

It's what emerges when we pay attention to one anothers insights and feelings while getting things done.










For queer youth activists, educational intimacy helped us treat each other well now, like we want LGBTQ+ youth to be treated in the future.

Educational Intimacy matters for learning in collective action spaces:


it's what allowed the Chroma youth to productively create presentations...
